


Dear friends,




SCIENCE

Our school regularly participates in science competitions such as the Olympiads for Biology, Chemistry and Physics to provide students with learning opportunities beyond the curriculum. These experiences also nurture creative thinkers and encourage awareness of Science's impact in our lives. Our Year 4 student, Zhang Qiyue, found the process of preparing for the competition enjoyable. She shared with us that "art students can also do well in the sciences".

The inaugural SOTA Sports Fiesta, held on 15 May at SUTD, was a vibrant showcase of leadership, organisation, and creativity of SOTA graduating students. EXPERIENTIAL

Art meets adventure! Our students took creativity to new heights with an exhilarating abseiling experience in school during Experiential Education class.

Two teams of Year 5 students participated in the International Mathematical Modelling Challenge (IMMC) and won Distinction Awards. In this challenge, participants develop a quantitatively focused approach to pet ownership that benefits animals and humans. The mathematical models determine which households are prepared to own a pet, how many households are pet-ready, in order to forecast future pet ownership. To create these mathematical models, the participants worked in teams of 4 for a week.

ENGLISH LITERATURE

The Year 3 students embarked on an integrative project designed by the Literature Faculty. They presented their understanding of their Literature text, *Frankenstein* through a creative product. Students explored issues such as the responsibility of the creator, a key theme in Shelley's seminal text. Aschea Ng (O4) shared, "This project allowed me to form connections between the arts and literature. I thoroughly enjoyed formulating ideas to respond to literary texts. Being in SOTA, I'm constantly exposed to a wide variety of art forms, allowing me to draw inspiration from my friends and surroundings to experiment with conveying my ideas through different artistic mediums."



Leadership Academy (LeAd) is a student leadership body that strives to promote growth and vibrancy within the SOTA community. LeAd organises events such as National Day celebrations to cultivate school culture, and executes initiatives to encourage leadership and teamwork within the student body. Overall, LeAd strives to empower students to explore their potential and passions beyond the classroom, while shaping school identity by fostering bonding between cohorts and providing exciting activities to enliven schooling life.

HUMANITIES & SOCIAL SCIENCES

Organised by the National Library Board, the Prove it!

Contest 2024 aims to equip students with news and nformation literacy skills. 2 teams from the faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS) participated in the NLB Prove it! Contest 2024 and SOTA came in first place in the Video Category! Both teams were also awarded the Gold (Video category) and Silver (Written category) awards respectively. Through this competition, the teams learnt more about the importance of information literacy and good research practices.



2024 has been a remarkable year for the SOTA Tchoukball CAS (Creativity, Activity, and Service), with all division teams securing top 4 positions in the 2nd ActiveSG-TBAS Inter-School Tchoukball Championships. 10 SOTA Tchoukball CAS members were also selected to represent Singapore in the M15 Girls, M15 Boys, M18 Girls, and M18 Boys categories at the Asia Pacific Youth Tchoukball Championships (APYTC). The teams performed admirably with the M15 Girls, M15 Boys, and M18 Boys securing 1st Runner-up positions, and the M18 Girls claiming gold in a nail-biting final, defeating Macau 28-27. Many congratulations to all our student-athletes for their outstanding performances and for bringing pride to both the school and the nation.



Twenty-one students from Class of 2024 earned the National Youth Achievement Award (Gold & Silver). Launched in 1992 by Singapore's President, the award encourages youth aged 13 to 30 to participate in activities that build self-reliance, perseverance, and responsibility. The award includes four categories: Service Learning (community volunteering), Outdoor Appreciation (environmental awareness), Healthy Living (health & fitness), and Community Leadership Initiative (promoting positive community impact). The journey concluded with an interview reflecting on their achievements. These students have gone beyond the requirements of IBDP Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) Core subject and have demonstrated growth and service.
